Role description: The Curve Foundation seeks a self-motivated creative to combine data visualization with art. The ideal candidate will collaborate with our archive and outreach manager in researching Curve magazine's iconic advice column "Ask Fairy Butch," using the wide-reaching topics it covers as inspiration for an art piece, which will be published in The Curve Foundation's digital quarterly. This is an excellent opportunity for a creative individual interested in LGBTQ+ history, aiming to establish themselves in the sapphic art community.

About us: [Curve magazine](#) launched in 1990, raising lesbian visibility in a way that connected the community and changed the way the mainstream sees queer women. The magazine covered news, politics, entertainment, pop culture, style, and travel from a lesbian perspective. It helped build a foundation for many intersectional movements being led by today's activists in the face of accelerating threats to the LGBTQ community.

The Curve Foundation champions lesbian, queer women, transgender and nonbinary people's stories and culture through intergenerational programming and community building. We bring the Curve magazine archive to life, providing context and a throughline between the critical conversations in the 1990s and early 2000s and today; we support the journalists who tell our stories; and we host events that bring our community together.
